For those of you that had a go at writing a new verse for 'Imagine' there are a couple of pointers that I'd like to give you. Your ideas were great but if they are to fit with the song there are a few things you need to make sure you do so that if we record your version it will sound right.

- 1st line: This must start with the word Imagine (and ideally be 7 syllables in total)
- 2nd line: Ideally 6 syllables in total
- 3rd line: Ideally 7 syllables (or close to 7)
